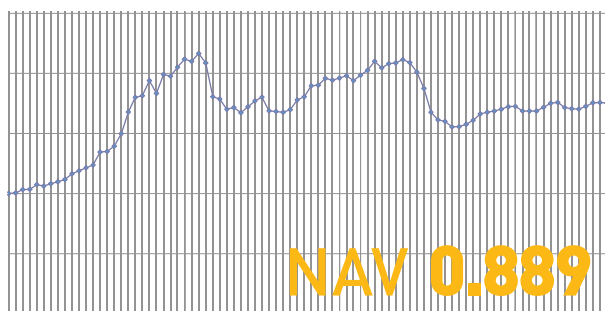

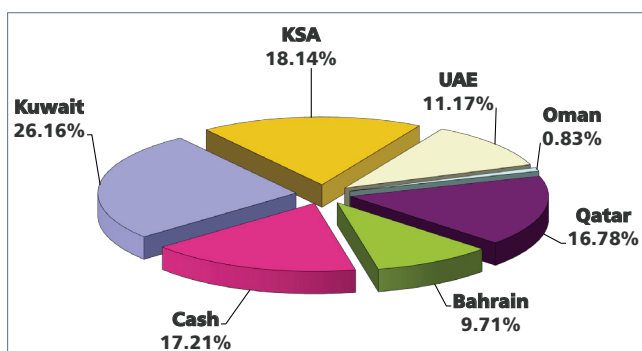

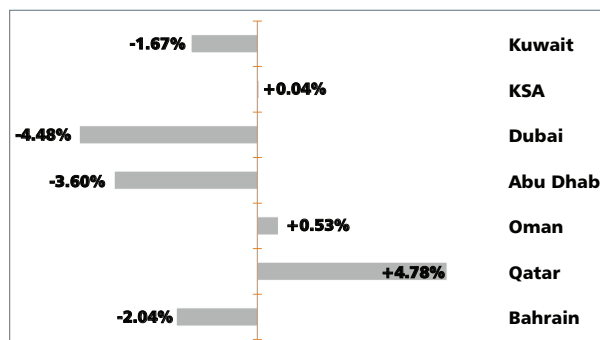

GCC market performance - Nov'10



Market review:

The GCC markets had mixed performance during November. For the month the KSE was -1.67%, Saudi +0.04%, Dubai -4.48%, Abu Dhabi -3.60%, Oman +0.53%, Qatar +4.78%, and Bahrain -2.04%.

During November, trading activity was dictated by country specific issues. Kuwaiti markets were severely affected by varying news and litigation issues on the Zain Deal with major shareholders having some differences in opinion. The Saudi markets tanked in the middle of the month but showed robust improvement to close almost flat by month end. Dubai and Abu Dhabi stocks continued to dip after a couple of good months. Qatar was the single largest gainer for the month with renewed confidence on their 2022 World cup bid and high levels of liquidity from Gas sales.

Fund review:

The Al-Ahli Gulf Fund recorded a small depreciation of -0.393% MTD and a gain of +7.657% YTD. The S&P GCC Composite Price Index lost -0.28% MTD and was up +8.13% YTD mainly due to the Saudi weight factor of the index. The Gulf Funds gain since inception stood at +75.407%, the NAV of the fund was KD 0.889067 on the NAV date.

The fund manager shall continue to take into account the volatility of the region as a whole in deciding the asset mix and cash percentages. This approach in turn has and will continue to reflect on the Fund's overall future performance. The current GCC allocations remain stable with a selective allocation of Blue Chip stocks across the region. The fund holdings are constantly monitored for the various risk factors by our investment team and appropriate action to rebalance the country allocation, cash percentages, as well as sector allocations is taken when needed.
